Position Summary:

The Campaign Fellows Program aims to support our endorsed candidates, train Fellows in the skills of effective electoral organizing, and turn out voters through direct voter contact.

To become a Campaign Fellow, you must first be selected by one of PTP's endorsed campaigns. PTP will pay you a stipend (see details below) and support your work through training and mentorship, all while you are directly embedded into the campaign's structure. This is a great opportunity for people of all backgrounds with a passion for politics to be trained in the tactics and techniques of organizing.

In addition to the hands-on learning and experience that comes with working on a campaign, you will develop a solid foundation in organizing and campaign-related skills through a comprehensive training program with PTP. You will also join a large network of Fellows across the country and have access to mentorship, support, and further learning. Our training program will help you build the essential skills to organize effectively, including the art and tools of canvassing, communicating your message to voters, recruiting and managing volunteer teams, and utilizing common campaign software.

Responsibilities:

- Complete day-to-day work in support of Direct Voter Contact (DVC) operations as assigned by the campaign, such as canvassing, phonebanking, and text messaging.
- Submit a weekly report to PTP on metrics such as door and phone attempts, door and phone conversations, and other outreach metrics to provide regular status updates and measure the impact of your work on the campaign and the Fellows program.
- Participate in weekly, live virtual trainings presented by PTP on topics such as canvassing, volunteer recruitment, GOTV planning, and more.
- Attend bi-weekly small group meetings, called cohort sessions, facilitated by a Fellows Program Coordinator to dive deeper into training topics and share best practices.
- Maintain timely communications with your assigned PTP Fellows Program Coordinator

Qualifications (You will be a good fit if):

- You are at least 18 years of age (as of September 6th, 2022) and legally authorized to work in the USA.
- You have some type of relationship with the campaign, live within the district, and are comfortable directly engaging with voters.
- You are committed to the success of the campaign on which you work and plan to continue in your role through Election Day, November 8, 2022.
- You have a passion for electing Democratic candidates.
- You are self-driven and can manage multiple tasks, relationships, and responsibilities at once.
- You're proficient in G Suite Products (Gmail, Calendar, Drive, etc).

Preferred Qualifications (Not Required):

- You are eager to engage in our training curriculum and learn the basics of electoral organizing.
- Additional language proficiency to communicate with your campaign's targeted voters.
